

INSPECT. CLEAN. DRY.

With **3** easy steps you can do your part to stop the spread of aquatic invasive species.

1 INSPECT

your fishing and boating gear for mud, water, or vegetation that could carry unwanted weeds or critters.

2 CLEAN

and remove all mud, water, and vegetation you find on boats, boots, or waders.

3 DRY

your boat and equipment. Aquatic invasives can survive only in water and wet areas.

AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES

are organisms that are intentionally brought into Montana from other places. They include fish, mussels, weeds, and pathogens.

These species are not wanted here. They damage river ecosystems and harm recreational and agricultural resources.

Aquatic invasive species can be spread when anglers, boats, and watercraft move from one body of water to another.
