And while the words might be simple, turning them into realities is far from it. Nor is it remotely possible without the help of members, volunteers, partners, and supporters of every kind. That's YOU. How did you help this year?

**YOU** kept fish out of hot

water, giving them access to cool headwaters streams when yet another scorcher of a summer turned up the heat on our waterways.

**YOU** kept our staff in cold water, providing funds for training, gear, travel, and data-crunching for our new snorkel-monitoring program, allowing us to see how fish and streams are responding to restoration and cleanup.

YOU kept new contamination out of our streams by helping to prevent ill-conceived mining proposals from becoming a reality.


YOU kept kids engaged and informed about their watershed by providing handson watershed science programs for students from Darby to Deer Lodge.

YOU protected groundwater and senior water rights by helping to defeat legislation that would re-open the exempt well loophole and allow unregulated and unfair groundwater pumping by subdivision developers.

YOU opened up migration pathways for native fish by removing instream barriers like under-sized culverts and antiquated irrigation diversions, which also helped ranchers secure more reliable water for their crops and
